The Glen is a beautiful park, Victorian water garden and leafy public space, sitting at the heart of the friendly market town of Honiton. It is a five-minute walk from the station and perfect for a short wander or a place to get some space before your meeting or have a picnic or to enjoy a short walk and a breath of fresh air.

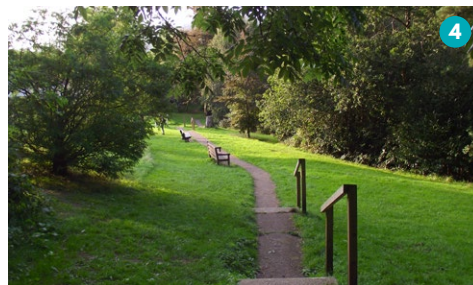
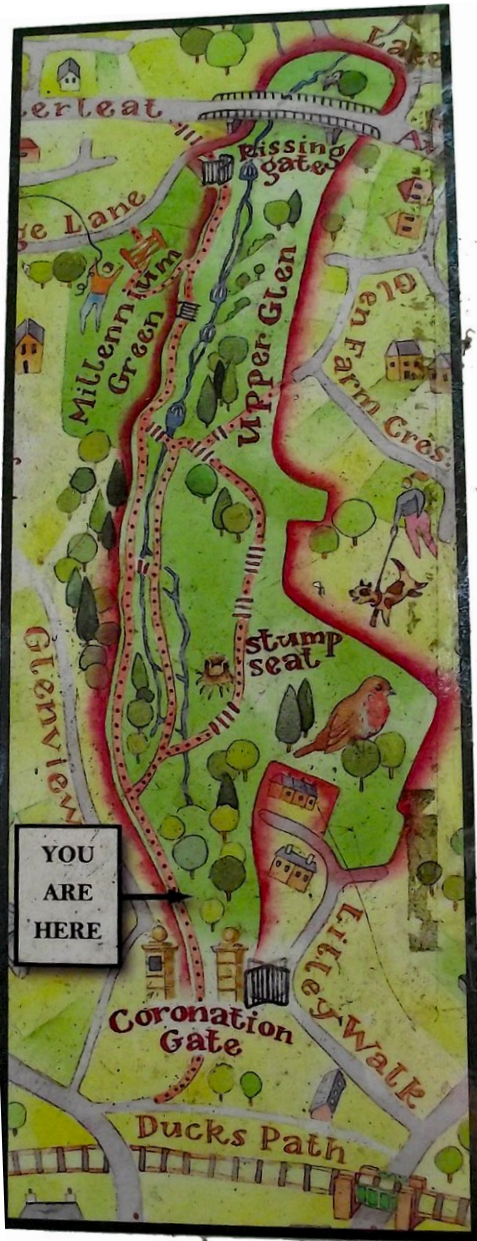
The park is managed by Honiton Town Council, supported by The Honiton Glen Conservation Group: www.e-voice.org.uk/friendsoftheglen

Directions

From Honiton station, exit left down the steps, cross a busy road and straight ahead into Duck's Lane (signposted public footpath). At the top turn sharp right into 'The Glen' through the Silver Jubilee gates. There is a map of the Glen just inside the gates (see overleaf).

Our suggestion is that you walk up through the Glen keeping left ([photo 1](#) overleaf) and then meander your way back, exploring the Millennium Green, the quiet area ([photo 2](#)) and the Upper Glen ([photo 3](#)). There are picnic tables in the Lower Glen ([photo 4](#)).
