



Calstock station to Cotehele National Trust

Enjoy a riverside and woodland walk from Calstock to Cotehele National Trust. Explore the house and gardens or extend your walk to Cotehele Quay and beyond.

Please note: the walk includes steep slopes as well as uneven surfaces as you come up through the woods.

After getting off the train at Calstock, from the platform follow the path down the hill until you come out on to the road (1 on map overleaf).

Continue down the hill, then follow the brown sign for Cotehele on your right (2).

Follow the road ahead, which leads you under the viaduct and along the riverside.

You will pass two old lime kilns along the way, as well as the impressive Danescombe House, which used to be a hotel.

Keep following the path until you see the signpost to Cotehele (3). As well as a steep climb, this path

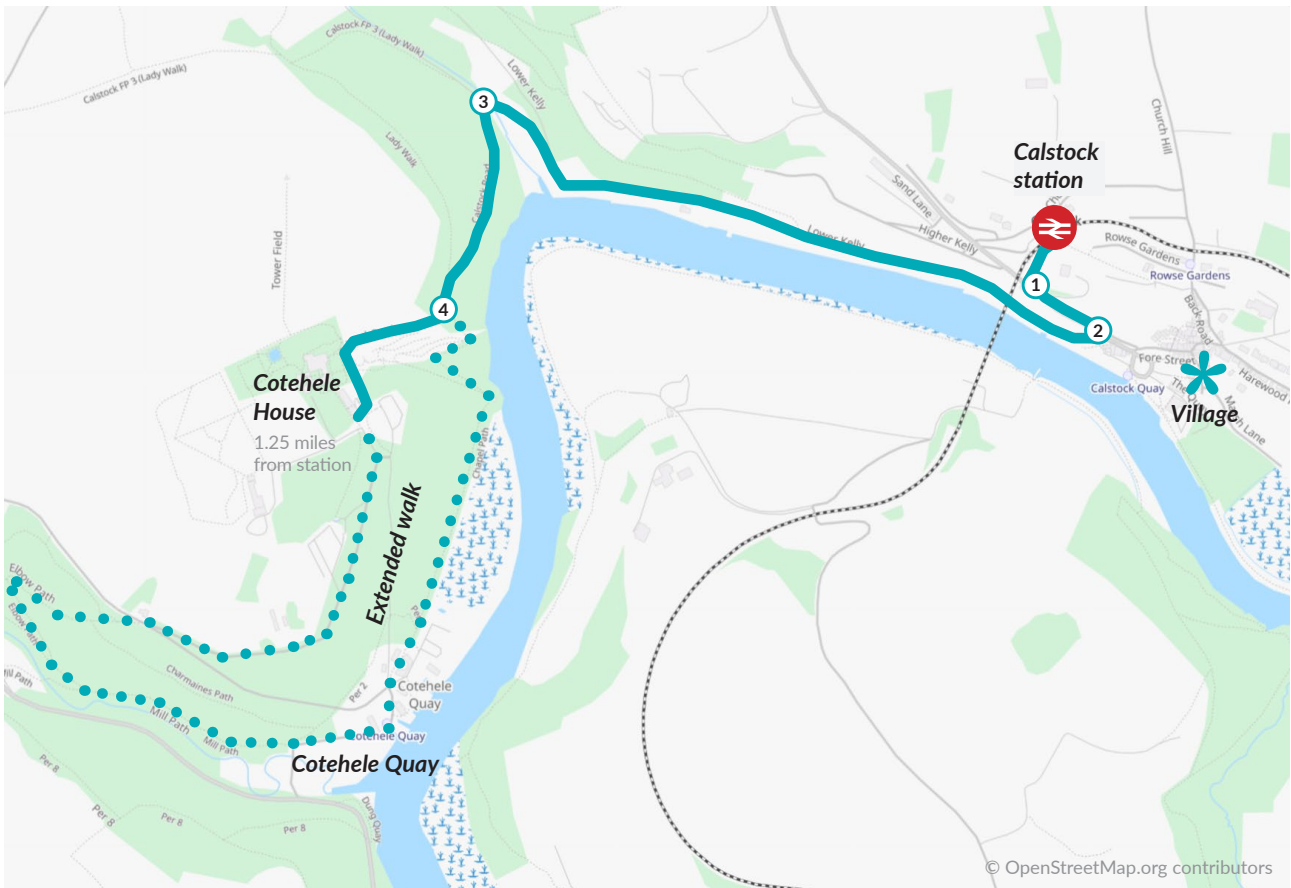
is stony and criss-crossed with tree roots, so take care and take your time.

You will notice the path soon splits (4) and here you have a choice. Take the right path to go up to Cotehele House where you can explore the house and gardens (admission rates apply) or take the left which heads down to Cotehele Quay and further walks into the woods beyond.

To get back to Calstock, simply re-trace your steps.
