



# Teignmouth to Dawlish

VIA THE SOUTH WEST COAST PATH

**Walk the famous seawall, ascend to Holcombe for great views from the South West Coast Path, then arrive into Dawlish and find the black swans...**

Exiting the front of Teignmouth station car park, use the island to cross the road.

Continue straight on down Hollands Street, with Teign Heritage Centre and Museum on your left (see [www.teignheritage.org.uk](http://www.teignheritage.org.uk) for opening times).

As the road opens out, follow as the road curves left and slightly uphill past the bus stop towards the ice cream kiosk on the seafront. Here, join the seafront walkway, heading left towards Eastcliff.

Continue along the seafront, where you'll be joined by the railway on your left. At Sprey Point you'll see the large Teignmouth sign. Continue along the seawall until it descends some steps at Smugglers Cove and goes under the railway.

There's now a steep climb up Smugglers Lane. At the top, carefully cross the main road and head right towards the bus stop.



**3.5 MILES | 1.5 TO 2 HOURS  
MODERATE (SEVERAL STEEP CLIMBS)**

**Start** Teignmouth station

**End** Dawlish station

A short while after the bus stop, cross back and take Windward Lane\* and then the Coast Path, signposted on your left. \*There are roadworks in May and June 2025 but there is still access.

The view soon opens out, with Dawlish visible ahead of you. The path descends down, close to the railway, before returning up towards the road.

Emerging at the main road again, immediately take Old Teignmouth Road off to your right. Follow this as it curves left and then right. Rejoining the main road once more, continue for around 80 metres then take the path on your right.

This will bring you out at Lea Mount, with views down on to Coryton Cove. Follow the paths down towards Dawlish and walk into town either on Marine Parade or along the seawall. In a few minutes you'll arrive at Dawlish town centre and the station.
